

CERTIFICATION PROCESS

AUDIT PREPARATION

Download the most current and applicable CSQ standard and take the CSQ 101 Online Training. Confirm the site is capable of meeting the CSQ requirements by completing an internal audit and correcting any non-conformances.

AUDIT PLANNING

Select a Certification Body and schedule the offsite documentation evaluation and the onsite facility evaluation.

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DOCUMENTATION EVALUATION

Submit all applicable documentation to your Certification Body and correct any nonconformances found during the documentation evaluation.

FACILITY EVALUATION

Provide your Certification Body with access to the facility and applicable records for review and conduct an onsite mock recall.

POST AUDIT

5 Work with Certification Body to close out any non-conformances found during the facility evaluation. Once all nonconformances are approved by the Certification Body then a certificate will be issued.

MAINTENANCE

Ongoing communication with Certification Body if there are any major changes to products or processes. Continuous improvement of the site's cannabis safety & quality program.

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USE A REGISTERED CONSULTANT

Sites may choose to develop and implement their Cannabis Safety & Quality Program using their own qualified resources or they may utilize the services of a CSQ registered consultant. All CSQ registered consultants are required to obtain CSQ Lead Auditor Training and demonstrate through qualifications and work experience that they are able to effectively develop and implement a Cannabis Safety & Quality Program. CSQ 101 TRAINING

A site's CSQ Program Manager and any other employees who are responsible for creating, implementing, and maintaining the requirements of the CSQ Certification must participate in the "CSQ 101" training course or have equivalent training or work experience. The "CSQ 101" training course is not a mandatory requirement for CSQ Program Managers but it is strongly recommended.

CSQ LEAD AUDITOR TRAINING

The CSQ Lead Auditor Training is an advanced version of the CSQ 101 training which includes two additional modules, ISO 19011 (Lead Auditor Training) and Cannabis 101.
